


# CP160/CP170C GPS Chartplotter

# **Owner's Manual**



# Attenzione!


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# **1. GENERAL INFORMATION**

# 1.1 INTRODUCTION

The chartplotter is a computer specifically designed for nautical use but, more precisely, to ease and speed up all calculations, which so far have been done manually. The chartplotter displays the current position, the <u>speed</u>, and the <u>heading</u> of the boat and its <u>Track</u>. The user information like <u>Waypoints</u>, <u>Marks</u> and <u>Tracks</u> can be stored on a optional <u>User C-CARD</u> (for backup) and can be recalled at any time. On the screen are shown navigation data and cartographic information obtained from electronic charts **C-MPINI** G=GARD.

# 1.2 IF YOU NEED ASSISTANCE

If your chartplotter does not operate properly, go to the System Test on Section 7.1. Most common operating difficulties can be diagnosed using these tests. 


Figure 1.2 - About Page


# **3. CONTROLS AND INDICATORS**

#### NOTE

This Section defines each control of the chartplotter. For detailed operating instructions, refer to Section 8. Refer to Figure 3.1 for the location of the following keys and connections.

# 3.1 CONTROLS AND CONNECTIONS

The chartplotter is controlled by using 15 keys: 10 labelled keys are dedicated to specific functions; the other 5 keys (hereinafter named <u>soft keys</u>) have different functions associated depending on the software: their labels are shown on the screen immediately above the keys (the user can customize the function associated, see Section 3.1.1). There is also a *ShuttlePoint* knob to move a cursor across the screen. As you press a key, a single audio beep confirms the key action; every time the key pressed is not valid, three rapid beeps sound indicates that no response is available.





There are two different modes to change chart scale "By Zoom" and "By Scale".

'MENU'+ "GENERAL SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "ZOOM TYPE" + 'ENTER' + "By Zoom" + 'ENTER'

Pressing the 'ZOOM IN' shows more detail of a smaller area, by changing the chart scale and zooming in on your display. Press 'ZOOM OUT' to change the scale and show a wider, otherwise less detailed view. Pressing and holding 'ZOOM IN'/ZOOM OUT' allows the quick zoom, that is the fast change of the chart scale where only the land areas are drawn. When 'ZOOM IN'/ZOOM OUT' is released all map details are shown. > 'MENU' + "GENERAL SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "ZOOM TYPE" + 'ENTER' + "By Scale"

#### + 'ENTER'

When 'ZOOM IN' or 'ZOOM OUT' is pressed the chartplotter will show the zoom window: pressing the 'ZOOM IN'/'ZOOM OUT' or moving the *ShuttlePoint* knob up/ down moves the scale and bar graph, press 'ENTER' to zoom to the scale. Press 'CLEAR' to quit the zoom window and keep the selected chart scale.

#### NOTE

Due to the cartography contained in the C-MP  $\square$  G-CARD there will be multiple charts shown within the same scale range.



## ShuttlePoint knob

The *ShuttlePoint* knob moves the cursor about on the display screen, quickly and accurately. It also scrolls the desired option in the menu page(s). If in <u>Home (Navigate)</u> mode, it allows to exit from <u>Home</u> mode to Cursor mode.

#### 

Press 'ENTER' to select the desired option or to confirm selection.

# 5 The CLEAR key

From the chart display press 'CLEAR' to set <u>Home</u> mode. Also press 'CLEAR' to exit from menu or data windows or to leave a menu without making changes, to abort selected function or to step backward from a selection made in the menu.



Selects the Main Menu. When in Menu mode, moving the *ShuttlePoint* knob to the right enters a selection, moving the knob to the left clears the function.

If pressing 'MENU' for 3 seconds from map display activates Edit mode to choose data to be shown in General, 1 Line Small, 1 Line Large or 2 Lines Small windows. If pressing 'MENU' for 3 seconds from Data pages (<u>Navigation, Highway, GPS Status,</u> NMEA Display) allows to customize all data fields shown in the selected page.

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Allows the user to select a Destination point at the cursor or a saved Route or Mark.



Places <u>Mark</u> under the cursor position (in <u>Home</u> mode <u>Mark</u> is placed under the ship's position).



Places Waypoints to make Routes.



Press 'PWR' to turn the chartplotter On. Press and hold 'PWR' down (once the chartplotter has been turned On) for 3 seconds turns the chartplotter Off. Press and immediately release 'PWR' to adjust light and contrast of the display.



Sets MOB (Man OverBoard).



The software keys (hereinafter named <u>soft keys</u>) are used from the chart screen or from the data pages to select one of the data pages available so allow a faster access to the page selection executable from the Main Menu.

When the chart page or any data screen is selected, the <u>soft key</u>s labels are not shown. By pressing one of the five <u>soft key</u>s their labels for the current functions are shown on the screen immediately above the <u>soft key</u>s. When the <u>soft key</u>s labels are shown, pressing the associated <u>soft key</u>s the relative function is executed. Pressing 'CLEAR' the five <u>soft key</u>s labels disappears.

#### 3.1.1 Soft keys Customization

Note that when the <u>soft key</u>s labels are shown the user can customize them. Pressing and holding any of the five <u>soft key</u> shows a pop-up window that contains all possible data pages assignable to the <u>soft key</u>s. Move the *ShuttlePoint* knob up/down to place the selector on the desired item; move the *ShuttlePoint* knob to the right or press 'ENTER' to set the selected item; move the *ShuttlePoint* knob to the left or press 'CLEAR' to close the pop-up window.

The possible choices are:

LOG	'Dsc Log'	(VHF Radio <u>DSC LOG</u> page, see Section 3.2.6)

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DIRECTORY	'Dsc Diri'	(DSC <u>Directory</u> page)
DISPLAY	'DISPLAY'	(Display page, see Section 3.2.7.1)
DATA	'Dατα'	(Data page, see Section 3.2.7.2)






Figure 3.2 - Screen display pages

# 3.2.1 Chart

#### ➤ 'MENU' + "CHART" + 'ENTER'

or

> press any soft key + 'CHART' (if it is present)

Shows the chart display and <u>Data Window</u> (Text Area if selected). With the following procedure:

'MENU' + "GENERAL SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "DATA WINDOW" + 'ENTER'

it is possible to customize the Data Window layout among (see following Sections):

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


Figure 3.2.1 - Data window layout

It is also possible to edit fields shown in every screen configuration. Edit mode is activated directly from the chart display pressing 'MENU' for 3 seconds. Once the Edit mode is active, the first box with the label turns gray and its frame is drawn bold. The user can choose the active box by moving the *ShuttlePoint* knob left or right. Pressing 'ENTER' the user can choose the data to be shown on the selected

field by moving through the selections and pressing 'ENTER' again.




Figure 3.2.1a - Edit mode

If the selected data type can be shown with different units of measure the list of the units is shown next to it. Once 'ENTER' is pressed the data type and its unit are set. The selection window is closed and the <u>Data Window</u> changes according to the selected data type.

Press 'CLEAR' to exit the Edit mode.




When in <u>Home</u> mode the coordinates field ③ shows ship's coordinates; also it is possible to choose the data to be displayed in the four fields ③, ④.

When in <u>Home</u> mode the cursor window (() and ()) is not shown; the three fields (), (), () are selectable fields.

It is possible to use small (1 line small) or large (1 line large) characters to display the information.

Otherwise it is possible to use small characters on two lines to display information:

'MENU' + "GENERAL SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "DATA WINDOW" + 'ENTER' + "2 lines small" + 'ENTER'



As in the previous Figure 3.2.1.2, when in <u>Home</u> mode the coordinates field (a) shows ship's coordinates; the six fields (a), (a), (a), (b), (c) are selectable fields as described in the previous Section 3.2.1.

#### 3.2.1.3 Full chart

It is also possible to show the cartography at full screen:

'MENU' + "GENERAL SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "DATA WINDOW" + 'ENTER' + "None" + 'ENTER'




Figure 3.2.1.3 - Full Map Display

# 3.2.2 Navigation Data Page


#### ➤ 'MENU' + "NAVIGATION" + 'ENTER'

or

#### press any soft key + 'NAV' (if it is present)

Shows <u>Compass</u> display, fix position and the most relevant navigation information. <u>Compass</u> ruler ① and <u>Lat/Lon</u> ② fields are fixed fields and cannot be changed. The last six fields (③, ④, ⑤, ⑥, ⑦, ⑧) are selectable fields (<u>default</u> values are DST, <u>BRG</u>, <u>TTG</u>, <u>XTE</u>, <u>SOG</u>, <u>COG</u>) as described in the previous Section 3.2.1.

# 3.2.3 Highway Page

#### ➤ 'MENU' + "HIGHWAY" + 'ENTER'

or

#### > press any soft key + 'HIGHWAY' (if it is present)

Shows the 3D <u>Highway</u> and the most relevant navigation information. It is possible to customize all fields shown in the page as described in the previous Section 3.2.1. The scale of the <u>Highway</u> display can be changed by pressing 'ZOOM IN'/'ZOOM OUT'; the ranges available are 0.2, 0.5, 1.0, 2.0, 4.0, 10.0 Nm.




Figure 3.2.3 - Highway Page

## 3.2.4 Celestial Page

- ➤ 'MENU' + "CELESTIAL" + 'ENTER'
- or
- press any soft key + 'CELEST' (if it is present)

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Shows the Moon phases, Sunrise/Sunset time and Low Water/High Water level at current location.

The day can be moved in the calendar by moving the ShuttlePoint knob left/right; use 'ZOOM IN'/'ZOOM OUT' to change the month.




Figure 3.2.4 - Celestial Page

## 3.2.5 GPS Status Page

➤ 'MENU' + "GPS" + 'ENTER'

or

press any soft key + 'GPS' (if it is present)

NOTE

To bypass this screen press 'CLEAR' to revert to the chart. Screen will default to chart page when fix is received.

Shows GPS satellites information. This is the default page shown at power on.




Figure 3.2.5 - GPS Status page

# 3.2.6 VHF Radio DSC LOG Page

'MENU' + "DSC" + 'ENTER' + "LOG" + 'ENTER'

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# or > press any soft key + 'Log' (if it is present)

Shows the <u>Distress Call</u> LOG page or <u>Position Request</u> LOG page (it depends which of the two was selected. The <u>default</u> is <u>Distress Call</u> LOG page). Press 'CLEAR' to return to chart display.

Use the *ShuttlePoint* knob up/down to move the selection through the list and left/right to select active function:

#### Locate

Centers the map on the selected position.

#### Delete

Deletes selection position.

## Delete All

Deletes all entries.

#### **Hide/Show**

Allows hiding/showing the selected points on the chart display. The <u>default</u> value of the field is Yes (object shown on the map).

#### **Position Request**

Shows <u>Position Request</u> LOG page. When <u>Position Request</u> LOG page is active this message changes to <u>Distress Call</u> LOG page.

# 3.2.7 NMEA DISPLAY Pages

NOTE

Certain data fields will not operate unless the chartplotter is interfaced with another NMEA instrument.


#### 3.2.7.1 Display Page

'MENU' + "NMEA DISPLAY" + 'ENTER' + "DISPLAY" + 'ENTER' or
Or

> press any soft key + 'DISPLAY' (if it is present)

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
It is possible to choose the page layout (the number of fields in the page) and the type of data shown in each of the fields in the page as described in the previous Section 3.2.1. If the selected type of data is not received the field shows dashes.



Data selectable are: <u>SOG</u>, <u>COG</u>, DST, <u>BRG</u>, <u>XTE</u>, <u>TTG</u>, ALT, <u>HDOP</u>, VDOP, BOAT

SPEED, <u>HEADING</u>, DEPTH, TRIP LOG, WATER TEMP, TRUE WIND SPEED, TRUE WIND DIRECTION, APPARENT WIND SPEED, APPARENT WIND DIRECTION. To change pages move the *ShuttlePoint* knob to the left or to the right. Press and hold 'MENU' for 3 seconds to change the data fields in the windows.

#### 3.2.7.2 Data Page



#### press any soft key + 'DATA' (if it is present)

Shows the stream of <u>NMEA-0183</u> sentences read from the NMEA port. Pressing 'ENTER' stops/starts alternatively the page update.

Shows the graph of the <u>Depth</u> received from the NMEA Port. Pressing 'ZOOM IN'/ 'ZOOM OUT' changes the time scale.

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


Figure 3.2.7.3 - Depth Graph Page




Figure 3.2.7.4 - Wind Speed Graph Page








Figure 3.2.7.6 - SOG Graph Page





Figure 4.1.1 - Installing/removing chartplotter





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# 4.1.3 Turning the chartplotter On and Off

Before powering On the chartplotter, check for the correct voltage (10-35 volt dc), the correct polarity and be sure that the supplied 1A Fuse is wired in series on the PWR - (Black) wire:






Figure 4.1.3 - Power On

Check also for the correct connection of the GPS antenna.

#### 4.1.3.1 Turning On

Press and hold 'PWR' for 1 second. The chartplotter emits one rapid beep sound and the Start-Up pages are opened:




Figure 4.1.3.1 - Start-Up pages



The software version ① is subject to change without notice.

After a few seconds, the first of the two Caution Notice pages is displayed, reminding you that the chartplotter is only an aid to navigation, and should be used with appropriate prudence. The electronic charts are not intended to substitute official charts. Then the cartographic screen is displayed.

#### 4.1.3.2 Turning Off

Press 'PWR' and hold for 3 seconds: a countdown timer appears on the screen, if you release the key before the countdown timer reaches zero, the chartplotter will remain On.

# 4.1.4 Changing Light and Contrast

Press and immediately release 'PWR' (do not press and hold the key, or the "poweroff" message will be displayed!): use the *ShuttlePoint* knob to increase/decrease the light (move it left/right) and the contrast (move it up/down). Press 'ENTER' to confirm the setting.

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# 4.1.5 Selecting the Language

It is possible to select the <u>Language</u> in which you wish information to be displayed (for screen labels, menus and options, but it does not affect the map information). The <u>default</u> setting is English.

➤ 'MENU' + "GENERAL SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "LANGUAGE" + 'ENTER' Choose the Language you want and press 'ENTER' to confirm.

# 4.1.6 Setting the NMEA Sentences

#### 4.1.6.1 Internal GPS Setup

It is possible to set the desired configuration for the Internal GPS.

'MENU' + "ADVANCED SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "INPUT/OUTPUT" + 'ENTER' + "INTERNAL GPS SETUP" + 'ENTER'

On the screen a menu is shown with the following options (0, (2), (3)).

#### 1 Restart GPS

Restarts all GPS processes.

#### (2) Static Navigation

Sets up a threshold for the <u>speed</u>. When the <u>speed</u> received from the positioning device is under that threshold, the chartplotter displays zero. The <u>default</u> value is On.

#### (3) Differential Correction Source

Allows the selection of the <u>Differential Correction Source</u> signal among None, <u>WAAS</u> and External <u>RTCM</u>. If the "NMEA2/RTCM INPUT" is set to NMEA the option External RTCM cannot be selected. The chartplotter shows a Warning message. The <u>default</u> setting is <u>WAAS</u>.

#### 4.1.6.2 Autopilot Output

To connect the chartplotter to an Autopilot, select the desired sentences.

'MENU' + "ADVANCED SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "INPUT/OUTPUT" + 'ENTER' + "AUTOPILOT OUTPUT" + 'ENTER'

#### 4.1.6.3 NMEA1 Output & NMEA2 Output

Allows selecting the set of <u>NMEA-0183</u> sentences transmitted by the chartplotter. For NMEA1:

#### 'MENU' + "ADVANCED SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "INPUT/OUTPUT" + 'ENTER' + "NMEA1 OUTPUT" + 'ENTER'

For NMEA2:

'MENU' + "ADVANCED SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "INPUT/OUTPUT" + 'ENTER' + "NMEA2 OUTPUT" + 'ENTER'




Figure 4.1.6.3 - NMEA Sentences

#### 4.1.6.4 NMEA2/RTCM Input

Selects the input type among NMEA and RTCM 1200, 2400, 4800, 9600, 19200, 38400 (where the number means the Baud Rate of the RTCM signal). By selecting RTCM the Differential Correction Source is automatically set to External RTCM. If NMEA2/RTCM Input is different from NMEA or RTCM 4800, the NMEA2 Output is stopped and a warning message will be shown. The default setting is NMEA.

▶ 'MENU' + "ADVANCED SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "INPUT/OUTPUT" + 'ENTER' + "NMEA2/RTCM INPUT" + 'ENTER'

#### 4.1.6.5 Send/Rec RTE&MARKS Port

Allows selection from which port the NMEA RTE and WPL sentences are sent/ received (to transfer Marks or Routes).

'MENU' + "ADVANCED SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "INPUT/OUTPUT" + 'ENTER' + "SEND/REC RTE&MARKS PORT" + 'ENTER'

## 4.1.7 Additional C-CARDs

The chartplotter uses two types of C-MAP optional cartridges: either a chart cartridge or a data storage cartridge. A chart cartridge, called C-CARD, contains detailed charts of the area covered. A data storage cartridge, called User C-CARD can be used to permanently store your <u>Waypoints</u>, <u>Marks</u> and <u>tracks</u>.

#### 4.1.7.1 Inserting C-CARD

Hold the C-CARD by the long inclined side so that you can see the C-MAP label.




Figure 4.1.7.1 - Inserting/Removing C-CARD (I)

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Open the door (see <sup>(3)</sup> in Figure 3.1), gently push the C-CARD into one of the two slots; push the C-CARD in as far as it will go, then close the door to hold fixed into the slot (as shown in the following Figure 4.1.7.1a).




Figure 4.1.7.1a - Inserting/Removing C-CARD (II)

#### 4.1.7.2 Removing C-CARD

Open the door and remove the C-CARD out of one of the two slots (as shown in the previous Figure 4.1.7.1a).

# 4.2 C-MAP NT INFORMATION

Looking at the chart displayed on the screen, you will see a variety of objects and symbols. Refer to the **L-MAP** *Ma* Handbook for their explanation.

The display can be customized for your personal preferences and needs (see Section 8 <u>Map Setup, Land Settings, Marine Settings, Nav Aids Settings, Chart Settings, Other Settings</u>).

# 4.2.1 Getting Quick Info

Place the cursor on a cartographic object; an information window is opened on the screen containing the main information and symbols identifying that object:

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To expand information (to obtain all information) about that object press 'ENTER':




Figure 4.2.1a - Expanded information

# 4.2.2 Information Function

Place the cursor in any place you want and press 'MENU' + "**INFORMATION**" + 'ENTER' to obtain a whole screen page where a list of all objects (in a tree structure), found in the range of the cursor, is displayed; if there are complex objects (collection of objects logically related) you will also find a list of the components:





Figure 4.2.2 - Info on cartographic objects

To select the object shown in reverse video screen use the *ShuttlePoint* knob. In the right bottom a window containing the selected object icon is opened. Press 'ENTER' to expand. If the information is contained in several pages, to select the following pages use the *ShuttlePoint* knob. To return to previous page and exit press 'CLEAR'.

# 4.2.3 Getting Port Info

Upon viewing the chart of a port or harbor, you will see a <u>Port Info</u> icon that can be querried to see the available information immediately displayed with many details. The <u>Port Info</u> icon is visible only if the <u>Ports & Services</u> option is On (<u>default</u> setting).




Figure 4.2.3a - Quick Info window




Figure 4.2.3b - Full Info (I)

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


Figure 4.2.3c - Full Info (II)




Figure 4.2.4 - Tide Info icon

Place cursor on the <u>Tide</u> symbol, a Quick Info window is opened:





Figure 4.2.4a - Quick Info on Tide

To display the Tide Graph page press 'ENTER':



Using the *ShuttlePoint* knob, it is possible to move the cursor anywhere on the graph and display the time, height (vertical cursor) and draught (horizontal cursor) on a particular graph point.

Also use 'ZOOM IN' or 'ZOOM OUT' to go to previous or next day and 'ENTER' to set date (move the *ShuttlePoint* knob up/down to insert the desired number and move it left/right to move cursor to left/right, press 'ENTER' to confirm).

<u>Tide</u> graphs are an approximation of the <u>tide</u> and they should be used in conjunction with traditional <u>tide</u> tables and navigational methods.

# 4.2.5 Finding Tide Stations

Finds the nearest <u>Tide Stations</u> (up to 10) on the map, from the boat position - if a valid fix is received - or from the cursor position - if the fix position is not good.

'MENU' + "FIND" + 'ENTER' + "TIDE STATIONS" + 'ENTER'

After a few seconds a window appears. Choose the <u>Tide Station</u> you want and press 'ENTER' to display the <u>Tide</u> Graph page (see Figure 4.2.4b). Press 'CLEAR' to display the <u>Tide Station</u> chosen.

# 4.2.6 Finding Port Services

To locate and display the nearest available facilities (up to 10) of a particular type (i.e. the nearest Hospital, sailmaker, bank, etc.).

➤ 'MENU' + "FIND" + 'ENTER' + "PORT SERVICES" + 'ENTER' The icons list is shown of the available Port Services:

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


Figure 4.2.6 - Port Services

# 4.3 USING MARKS

You may place a Mark on cursor position by pressing 'MARK'.

#### 4.3.1 Marks

You may mark a location on the chart with a <u>Mark</u> symbol and number, which you can record for later use. <u>Marks</u> can be stand-alone or can be linked to a <u>Route</u>. Every time you place the cursor on a <u>Mark</u> the following functions are available: Deleting <u>Mark</u> (see 4.3.1.2 Section), Moving <u>Mark</u> (see 4.3.1.3 Section), Editing <u>Mark</u> (see 4.3.1.4 Section), Finding information on <u>Marks</u> (see 4.3.1.5 Section).

#### 4.3.1.1 Adding Mark ➤ 'MARK'

The new <u>Mark</u> appears on your cursor position. An info window with icon, name, coordinates, <u>Distance</u> and <u>Bearing</u> from Fix to <u>Mark</u> is shown (see next Figure 4.3.1.3). If <u>Mark</u> belongs to a <u>Route</u>, the information window looks like the one for the <u>Waypoint</u> and the options applicable to the <u>Mark</u> are the same options applicable to a <u>Waypoint</u>.

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#### 4.3.1.2 Deleting Mark

► Place cursor on Mark

Press 'ENTER'. Select "DELETE" and press 'ENTER'.

#### 4.3.1.3 Moving Mark





Figure 4.3.1.3 - Moving Mark (I)




Figure 4.3.1.3b - Moving Mark (III)

Use the *ShuttlePoint* knob to select the field. If you have selected name field, press 'ENTER': use the *ShuttlePoint* knob to insert the character (10 characters max), then press 'ENTER'. If symbol field is selected press 'ENTER': a window with 16 different symbols appears. Use the *ShuttlePoint* knob to select the symbol and press 'ENTER'. If coordinates field is selected, press 'ENTER' and then use the *ShuttlePoint* knob to insert the value. Then press 'ENTER'.

**Only for CP 170C**: If Color field is selected, press 'ENTER'. A window with 8 different colors appears, use the *ShuttlePoint* knob to select the desired color and press 'ENTER'.

## 4.3.1.5 Finding information on Marks: User Points List page ➤ Place cursor on Mark

Press 'ENTER'. Select "**DIRECTORY**" and press 'ENTER'. A full window is opened showing information about all stored <u>User Points</u> (Marks and <u>Waypoints</u>). Move up/ down the *ShuttlePoint* knob to select the <u>User Point</u> you wish. If the page contains more than 7 <u>User Points</u>, the list continues in the next pages. See Section 4.4.1.9 for additional information.

## 4.4 ABOUT CREATING AND USING ROUTES

At anytime, you may add or delete <u>Waypoints</u>, see a <u>Route</u> summary, reverse the direction of the <u>Route</u> or erase the entire <u>Route</u>.


## 4.4.1 Waypoints

You may add <u>Waypoint</u>s, delete <u>Waypoint</u>s from a <u>Route</u>, move any <u>Waypoint</u> in the <u>Route</u> to another location, insert a <u>Waypoint</u> between two existing ones, find any <u>Waypoint</u> at anytime. Every time you place the cursor on a <u>Waypoint</u> the following functions (see from 4.4.1.3 to 4.4.1.9 Section) are available.

## 4.4.1.1 Adding Waypoint


## > 'ROUTE'

When 'ROUTE' is pressed a <u>Waypoint</u> appears on cursor position. When the cursor is placed on a <u>Waypoint</u> a window is shown containing information on <u>Waypoint</u>:



## 4.4.1.2 Creating a Route

Repeat the "Adding Waypoint" procedure described in the previous Section 4.4.1.1 "Adding Waypoint". The sequence of moving the cursor and pressing 'ROUTE' is continued to create the <u>Route</u>, until you have reached the last <u>Waypoint</u>, your final destination. Segments connecting the <u>Waypoint</u>s are shown and the starting point is identified by a circle surrounding the first <u>Waypoint</u> of the <u>Route</u>:

To create another Route, press 'MENU' + "ROUTE" + 'ENTER' + "SELECT" + 'ENTER', then select open position and press 'ENTER'.




Figure 4.4.1.3a - Deleting Waypoint (II)

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



Figure 4.4.1.5 - Moving Waypoint (I)

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


Figure 4.4.1.6a - Placing Waypoint between two existing ones (II)




Figure 4.4.1.6b - Placing Waypoint between two existing ones (III)




Figure 4.4.1.7 - Edit Waypoint (I)




Figure 4.4.1.7a - Edit Waypoint (II): Waypoint symbols




Figure 4.4.1.8 - Route Report page




Figure 4.4.1.9 - User Points List page

## ▶ 'MENU' + "USER POINTS" + 'ENTER' + "EDIT" + 'ENTER'

Allows editing name, symbol, (Color - **Only for CP 170C**) coordinates of the selected <u>User Point</u>. The coordinates of any <u>User Point</u> belonging to the active <u>Route</u> cannot be changed.

## **Deleting selected User Point**

## ► 'MENU' + "USER POINTS" + 'ENTER' + "DELETE" + 'ENTER'

Deletes the selected <u>User Point</u>. A warning message appears, select "**YES**" and press 'ENTER' ('CLEAR' otherwise). If the selected point is the <u>Target</u> (<u>Destination</u>), the chartplotter shows a warning message saying that the function cannot be executed. The <u>Target</u> must be deactivated before deleting the selected point. Also if the selected point belongs to the active <u>Route</u> (the <u>Route</u> with the <u>Target</u>) it cannot be deleted.

## **Deleting All User Points**

### 'MENU' + "USER POINTS" + 'ENTER' + "DELETE ALL" + 'ENTER'

Deletes all <u>User Point</u> in the list. A warning message appears, select "**YES**" and press 'ENTER' ('CLEAR' otherwise). If one of the points is the <u>Target</u> (<u>Destination</u>), the chartplotter shows a warning message saying that the function cannot be executed. The <u>Target</u> must be deactivated before deleting the selected point. Note that deleting <u>User Points</u> also <u>Route</u>s are deleted.

## **Sending User Points**

## 'MENU' + "USER POINTS" + 'ENTER' + "SEND" + 'ENTER'

Allows sending all <u>User Points</u> in the list to an external device (depending on selected port).

### **Receiving User Points**

➤ 'MENU' + "USER POINTS" + 'ENTER' + "RECEIVE" + 'ENTER'

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Allows reading User Points from the NMEA input port (NMEA sentence WPL).

## 4.4.2 Routes

The following functions are used for the <u>Route</u> management. The chartplotter handles <u>Route</u>s from 1-20, which are permanently stored in the memory as they are created. Only one <u>Route</u> can be selected for work at any one time.

## 4.4.2.1 Selecting Route

## 'MENU' + "ROUTE" + 'ENTER' + "SELECT" + 'ENTER'

Use the *ShuttlePoint* knob to select the <u>Route</u> to work and press 'ENTER'.

## 4.4.2.2 Selecting Route Color - Only for CP 170C

## 'MENU' + "ROUTE" + 'ENTER' + "COLOR" + 'ENTER'

A window is opened: use the *ShuttlePoint* knob to select the <u>Route</u> color among the 8 colors available. Press 'ENTER' to confirm. The <u>Route</u> appears on the screen colored by the selected color. It is possible to select a different color for any <u>Route</u>.

## 4.4.2.3 Deleting Route

## ➤ 'MENU' + "ROUTE" + 'ENTER' + "DELETE" + 'ENTER'

A window is opened: select "**YES**" and press 'ENTER' to confirm (select "**NO**" and press 'ENTER' otherwise). The <u>Route</u> remains on the screen shaded until the screen is redrawn. Note that the active <u>Route</u> (the <u>Route</u> with the <u>Target</u>) cannot be deleted. A warning message is shown when the user tries to delete it. To delete <u>Route</u> see also Section 4.4.1.8.

## 4.4.2.4 Reversing Route

➤ 'MENU' + "ROUTE" + 'ENTER' + "REVERSE" + 'ENTER' Reverse current <u>Route</u> ends.

## 4.4.2.5 Report Route

## 'MENU' + "ROUTE" + 'ENTER' + "REPORT" + 'ENTER'

Shows information about <u>Route</u>, <u>Waypoint</u> position and name, <u>Distance</u> and <u>Bearing</u> between <u>Waypoint</u>, Fuel consumption. Allows changing the current <u>Route</u> and locating the <u>Route</u> on the map. See Section 4.4.1.8.

## 4.4.2.6 Sending Route to a PC program

## 'MENU' + "ROUTE" + 'ENTER' + "SEND" + 'ENTER'

Transmits current <u>Route</u> information (NMEA sentences WPL, RTE) on the NMEA Output port (selectable by the user in the <u>Input/Output</u> menu, <u>Send/Rec Rte & Marks</u> <u>Port</u> item see Section 8).

4.4.2.7 Receiving Route from a PC program ➤ 'MENU' + "ROUTE" + 'ENTER' + "RECEIVE" + 'ENTER'

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Saves <u>Route</u> information (NMEA sentences WPT, RTE) received from the NMEA Input port (selectable by the user in the <u>Input/Output</u> menu, <u>Send/Rec Rte & Marks</u> <u>Port</u> item see Section 8). The received <u>Route</u> is saved on the current <u>Route</u>. If the current <u>Route</u> contains data the chartplotter shows a warning window and asks the user if he wants to overwrite the existing <u>Route</u>.

## 4.5 GOTO FUNCTION

Once you have positioned the cursor on the desired point press 'GOTO': a window is shown with three options, "CURSOR", "ROUTE" and "MARK".

Otherwise if the cursor is near an existing <u>User Point</u> (<u>Mark</u> or <u>Waypoint</u>), pressing 'GOTO' the <u>Destination</u> is placed on that <u>User Point</u>. A circle around the <u>User Point</u> identifies the <u>Destination</u> point. When the <u>Destination</u> point is placed on a <u>Route</u>, when reached the <u>Destination</u> point will move to the next <u>Waypoint</u> of the <u>Route</u>.

## 4.5.1 Goto Cursor

## ➤ 'GOTO' + "CURSOR" + 'ENTER'

Places a Direct <u>Destination</u> at the cursor coordinates. The Direct <u>Destination</u> is a temporary <u>User Point</u> that will be removed when the navigation is stopped. The Direct <u>Destination</u> is drawn as a <u>Mark</u> with the circle around and it is labeled "DEST".




Figure 4.5.1 - Placing Destination on Cursor

## 4.5.2 Goto Route

## ➤ 'GOTO' + "ROUTE" + 'ENTER'

The <u>Route</u> selection window is shown. Select the <u>Route</u> you want and press 'ENTER' to activate the navigation on it. The <u>Destination</u> is always placed on the first <u>Waypoint</u> of the <u>Route</u>.

## 4.5.3 Goto Mark

## 'GOTO' + "MARK" + 'ENTER'

Shows the <u>User Points</u> List page. Select the desired <u>User Point</u> and press 'GOTO' to activate navigation toward the selected point. Press 'CLEAR' to exit from the <u>User</u> <u>Points</u> List page.

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# 4.5.4 Stopping Goto navigation

If the <u>Destination</u> point is already present, when 'GOTO' is pressed a window is shown. Select "**STOP**" and press 'ENTER' to stop navigating to the current <u>Destination</u>. Otherwise selecting "**START**" removes the current <u>Destination</u> and places a new one at the cursor position. If the cursor is near an existing <u>User Point</u> the <u>Destination</u> is set on it.

## 4.5.5 Placing Cursor on a Route

When the <u>Target</u> is set on a <u>Route</u>, placing cursor on it and pressing 'ENTER' shows an information window with the following options:

- 1) "STOP" to stop navigation and to remove the current Destination.
- "NEXT" to move <u>Destination</u> to the next <u>Waypoint</u> of the <u>Route</u>. When the <u>Destination</u> is on the last <u>Waypoint</u> this option is not present.
- 3) "**PREVIOUS**" to move <u>Destination</u> to the previous <u>Waypoint</u> of the <u>Route</u>. When the <u>Destination</u> is on the first <u>Waypoint</u> this option is not present.
- 4) "HIGHWAY" to bring up the Highway page (see Section 3.2.3).

## 4.6 MOB FUNCTION

Is an important function useful in case someone or something falls overboard.

## 4.6.1 Inserting MOB

Press 'MOB' to place MOB symbol at ship's coordinates:



Figure 4.6.1 - Placing MOB

## 4.6.2 Deleting MOB

Place cursor on MOB, press 'ENTER, select "DELETE" and press 'ENTER' again.

## 4.7 USING THE TRACK FUNCTIONS

The chartplotter can be set up to record your  $\underline{\text{Track}}$  as you move and for plotting on the chart.

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## 4.7.1 Enabling Track storing

## ▶ 'MENU' + "TRACK" + 'ENTER' + "TRACKING" + 'ENTER'

To enable (On) or disable (Off) the <u>Track</u> storing. It is not possible to use the <u>Track</u> storing if you are not receiving a valid fix. The <u>default</u> setting is On.

## 4.7.2 Selecting active Track

## 'MENU' + "TRACK" + 'ENTER' + "ACTIVE TRK" + 'ENTER'

Select the number of the active Tracks. The default setting is 1.

## 4.7.3 Displaying Track

## 'MENU' + "TRACK" + 'ENTER' + "VISIBLE" + 'ENTER'

To enable (On) or disable (Off) the displaying of Track. The default setting is On.

## 4.7.4 Selecting Track Line Pattern

## ➤ 'MENU' + "TRACK" + 'ENTER' + "LINE PATTERN" + 'ENTER'

Selects the desired <u>Line Pattern</u> for the active <u>Track</u>. **Only for CP 170C**: "Line Pattern" item is substituted by the "Color" item, to select the desired color among the 8 colors available for the selected <u>Track</u>.

## 4.7.5 Deleting Track

## ▶ 'MENU' + "TRACK" + 'ENTER' + "DELETE" + 'ENTER'

Deletes all <u>Track</u>. After pressing 'ENTER' a warning window appears: select "**YES**" and press 'ENTER' to confirm (select "NO" otherwise).

## 4.7.6 Selecting Track memorizing type

## ▶ 'MENU' + "TRACK" + 'ENTER' + "STEP UNIT" + 'ENTER'

Choose <u>Distance</u> (Dist) - the chartplotter can store a fix when the distance from its last stored position is greater than a defined distance; Time - the chartplotter can store a fix after a defined time. The <u>default</u> setting is Time.

## 4.7.7 Selecting distance

## ➤ 'MENU' + "TRACK" + 'ENTER' + "DISTANCE" + 'ENTER'

When the tracking function is On and the type of <u>Track</u> storing is <u>Distance</u>, you can store a fix when the <u>distance</u> from its last stored position is greater than a defined <u>distance</u>. Choose in the range 0.01, 0.05, 0.1, 0.5, 1.0, 2.0, 5.0, 10.0 Nm (the <u>distance</u> unit of measure is selected by the user, see Section 8). The <u>default</u> setting is 0.01 Nm.

## 4.7.8 Selecting time

'MENU' + "TRACK" + 'ENTER' + "TIME" + 'ENTER'

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
When the tracking function is On and the type of <u>Track</u> storing is Time, the chartplotter can store a fix after a defined time. Choose among 1, 5, 10, 30 sec, 1, 5, 10 min. The <u>default</u> setting is 1 sec.

## 4.8 USER C-CARD MENU

The chartplotter allows copying information to a <u>User C-CARD</u>. You can also return the information to internal memory at a later time. This allows virtually unlimited storage.





Figure 4.8 - User C-CARD Menu

Select the <u>file</u> name and press 'ENTER'. At first a <u>default</u> name is shown: use the *ShuttlePoint* knob to insert the name. Press 'ENTER'. Select the data type to save among "**MARK**", "**ROUTE**" or "**TRACK**".

### NOTE

When naming a <u>file</u>, you may have trouble finding a name that uniquely identifies the <u>file</u>'s contents. Dates, for example, are often used in filenames; however, they take up several characters, leaving you with little flexibility. The secret is to find a compromise, a point where you can combine a date with a word, creating a unique filename. The maximum length of the filename is 8 characters. The characters may be numbers (0, ..., 9), letters (A, ..., Z) and spaces (for example legal identifiers are "ABC", "AA", "12121212", "A B C", "1 A 1", and so on.

## ➤ 'MENU' + "USER C-CARD" + 'ENTER' + "LOAD" + 'ENTER' or

press any soft key + 'C-CARD' (if it is present) + "LOAD" + 'ENTER'

Before pressing 'ENTER', choose <u>file</u> name in the list shown on the screen using the *ShuttlePoint* knob.

## 4.8.3 Deleting File

#### 'MENU' + "USER C-CARD" + 'ENTER' + "DELETE" + 'ENTER' or

press any soft key + 'C-CARD' (if it is present) + "DELETE" + 'ENTER'

Before pressing 'ENTER', choose <u>file</u> name in the list shown on the screen using the *ShuttlePoint* knob.

A warning window is shown, select "**YES**" and press 'ENTER' to confirm deletion (select "**NO**" otherwise). This operation removes old or unnecessary <u>files</u> to clean up your <u>User C-CARD</u>. Remember that this option permanently erases the <u>file</u>.

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## 4.8.4 Formatting User C-CARD

➤ 'MENU' + "USER C-CARD" + 'ENTER' + "FORMAT" + 'ENTER' or

> press any soft key + 'C-CARD' (if it is present) + "FORMAT" + 'ENTER' A warning window is shown, select "YES" and press 'ENTER' to confirm the formatting

(select "**NO**" otherwise). The <u>format</u> of <u>User C-CARD</u> must be done before using a new <u>User C-CARD</u>: this operation prepares the <u>User C-CARD</u> to receive and store information.

## WARNING

This operation permanently erases all files previously saved on the User C-CARD.

## 4.8.5 Changing User C-CARD

# 7. TECHNICAL

## 7.1 SYSTEM TEST

If you have connected your chartplotter according to the instructions, and chosen the proper menu selection for your device, and are still having problems with your chartplotter, the extended auto-test should help determine the problem. Make sure the chartplotter is turned Off. While pressing and holding any other key, turn the chartplotter On. A new menu will appear on the display:

(1) Software name and version

2 NT Software Library version




Figure 7.1 - System Test

Use the *ShuttlePoint* knob to select the desired test. Choose the test press 'ENTER'. To exit from any submenu press 'CLEAR'. To exit from the System Test turn Off the chartplotter.

## 7.1.1 RAM Menu

This test verifies the integrity of the memories and if desired during this test all the internal memory can be erased and the <u>default</u> setting restored.




Figure 7.1.1 - RAM Menu

## 1 RAM Test

To verify the integrity of the RAM. If on the screen the message "ERROR" appears,

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the RAM is physically damaged. Contact your Dealer or STANDARD HORIZON.

## <sup>2</sup> RAM Clear

To clear internal memory. If the chartplotter exhibits unusual operations, or appears to be malfunctioning, it may be possible to correct the problem by clearing RAM. This operation will erase all <u>Marks</u>, <u>Routes</u>, stored <u>Track</u> plots and <u>Destinations</u>. It will also return all selections (Input Data Format, Autopilot selection, etc.) to original <u>default</u> values. To confirm clear RAM press 'ENTER' again (but if at this time you do not wish to clear RAM press 'CLEAR').

## 7.1.2 DIM Menu

To select the desired value for brightness and keypad light.




Figure 7.1.2 - DIM Menu

## 1 Contrast

Each time you move the *ShuttlePoint* knob to right, the screen will decrease brightness, move it to the left to increase brightness.

## <sup>2</sup> Backlight

The second option allows to set the backlight. Operates in similar mode as Contrast.

To check the C-CARD and its connector.




Figure 7.1.3 - C-CARD Menu

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## **1** Background ROM

To test the WorldWideBackground. If there is not a malfunction, the code of the Background and the message "OK" are shown, but if the Background is defective the message "Faulty" is shown.

## <sup>2</sup> C-CARD Test

To test the C-CARD. There are three possible situations:

- 1. if there is a C-CARD inserted in the slot and there is not a malfunction, the name of the C-CARD zone and the message "OK" are shown.
- 2. if there is a C-CARD inserted in the slot, but it is a defective C-CARD, the name of the C-CARD zone and the message "Faulty" are shown.
- 3. if there is not any C-CARD inserted in the slot, the message "not present" is shown.
- 4. if there is a <u>User C-CARD</u> inserted in the slot, the message "USER C-CARD" is shown.

## **3** C-CARD Connector

Indicates if there is a malfunction in the connector.

## 7.1.4 Serial Ports

If you are having problems receiving data from the position-finding instrument, this test should help determine the problem.




Figure 7.1.4 - Serial Ports Menu

## (1) Change Parameters

To change the parameters of the serial interface. This menu allows to select the **Port** (Signal Source) between EXT.PORT or DIFF.INPUT, the **Baud Rate** between 300, 1200, 2400, 4800 or 9600, the **Data Bits** (Word Length) between 7 or 8, the **Parity** between even, odd or none, the **Stop Bits** between 1 or 2, the **Polarity** between "+" or "-". <u>Default</u> settings are: Port = EXT.PORT, Baud Rate = 4800, Data Bits = 8, Parity = none, Stop Bits = 1, Polarity = +.

## <sup>2</sup> Input Data Display

To allow the chartplotter to act as a computer terminal and display the incoming data exactly as it is received.

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If the data displayed on the screen is unrecognizable, you may have selected the wrong input parameters for your particular receiver, for example, Baud Rate 9600 instead of Baud Rate 4800. Check your receiver manual to be sure that you have selected the proper parameter. If the screen is blank, you may have a broken connection, and no data is being received or you may have connected the device to the other input port.

Use 'ZOOM IN' to stop (or continue after pause) data displaying, 'ENTER' to show data in hex or ASCII mode (normal or small) and 'CLEAR' to exit.

# 8. TERMS & FUNCTIONS

This Section explains the terms that may be unfamiliar to the reader. The symbol ■ indicates that the term is followed only by an explanation, while the symbol ➤ indicates that the term is more widely explained; you will also find a brief description on how to select the related menu option, listing the operation a keys sequence with the menu names enclosed between double apices. For example 'MENU' + "USER POINTS LIST" + 'ENTER' means that you must press the 'MENU' key, using the *ShuttlePoint* knob to select the USER POINTS LIST item and then press the 'ENTER' key to display the User Points List page.

#### About (page)

Selects a page that gives information on software and cartography version and general software specification (as <u>User Points</u>, <u>Routes</u> and so on). For more information see Section 1.3. 'MENU' + "About..." + 'ENTER'

#### Active Track

Selects the number of the active <u>Track</u>. The <u>default</u> setting is 1. 'MENU' + "TRACK" + 'ENTER' + "ACTIVE TRACK" + 'ENTER'

#### Additional Second Factor (ASF)

Sets the ASF for the slave in the selected <u>chain</u>. The <u>default</u> setting is 0. 'MENU' + "ADVANCED SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "NAVIGATE" + 'ENTER' + "COORDINATE SYSTEM" + 'ENTER' + "TD" + 'ENTER' + "ASF1/2" + 'ENTER'

#### Advanced Setup (menu)

Selects the Fix, Navigate, Compass, Input/Output, Alarms, Simulation menus. 'MENU' + "ADVANCED SETUP" + 'ENTER'

#### Azimuth

The angular measurement from the horizon to a satellite or another object.

Sets the min/max value for <u>Bathymetrics</u> and Soundings. If the <u>depth</u> unit is Meters (Mt), the range is [0 - 12000], if Feet (Ft) is [0 - 39369], if Fathom (FM) is [0 - 6593]. **Bottom Type** Turns On/Off the displaying of Bottom Type (type, colour and other qualities of seabed). The <u>default</u> setting is On.

Turns On/Off the displaying of <u>Buoys</u> and <u>Beacons</u> (<u>buoys</u> and <u>beacons</u> are used to indicate to mariners recommended or established <u>Routes</u>, underwater dangers, restrictions and regulations. They can be lighted or not and - for the color chartplotter - are coloured according to their international code). The default setting is On.

The variation table is used to match magnetic value readout on the chartplotter comparable with the value given by the compass of the boat. In other words, since the compass of the boat must be compensated (due to the iron masses, ...), we use the same values given by the chartplotter. This means that, for example, if the <u>BRG</u> to the next <u>Waypoint</u> readout in the chartplotter display is "X" Mag degree, if you steer the boat reading "X" Mag degree from the compass, you are driving well toward the next Waypoint.




Figure 8 - Celestial page

#### > Chain

Selects the chain. The Loran chains are groups of transmitting stations that use timed radio pulse transmissions. In each of these chains there is a master station and two or more slave or secondary stations. Stations belonging to a same chain transmit pulses in timing groups: a different time base identifies each chain. The time base of each chain is the Group Repetition Interval or GRI. This GRI identifies the chain in unique mode. For example the GRI = 4990 identifies the chain of Central Pacific zone. The default setting is 9970.

#### Complex Object

Current official documentation S57 supports "Complex Object". Complex objects are nautical object not containing attributes, but grouping other (element) objects in one logical unit. For example, Navigation aid, float, is the name of one complex object that should group all the navigation aid objects floating in the sea: lights, buoys, radar reflector. Very often, navigational aid objects are grouped in complex objects. This does not mean that object usually belonging to complex objects can not exist even as simple instances. One buoy tower can exist both as stand alone object and it can exist as a part of one Navigational Aid, fixed or floating complex object. The decision of when one object will be encoded in one or another way is influenced by many rules on paper charts. Sometimes, it is better in one way, sometimes in another. Therefore, if can happen that one buoy on one scale level in one chart belongs to a complex object, and on the more detailed level in another chart the same object with the same coordinates can be a stand alone object. The default setting is Single.

### Compute Correction

Corrects fixes from the positioning instrument. By placing the cursor on the ship's real position and selecting this option, the error is calculated and internally memorized for appropriate correction, but not applied.

The optimum direction the boat should be steered in order to efficiently make headway back to the courseline while also proceeding toward the destination Waypoint.

#### Cultural Features

Enables (On) or disables (Off) the displaying of the Cultural Features (any man-made topographic feature as built-up area, buildings, roads, ...). The <u>default</u> setting is On. **'MENU' + "MAP SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "LAND SETTINGS" + 'ENTER' + "CULTURAL FEATURES" + 'ENTER'** 

Current

Non-periodical movement of sea-water, generally horizontal, due to many causes such as different temperatures and prevalent winds. Some may be temporary, others permanent.

#### Cursor Control

Enables (On)/disables (Off) the cursor control. The default setting is Off.

'MENU' + "ADVANCED SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "SIMULATION" + 'ENTER' + "CURSOR CONTROL" + 'ENTER' Customize Soft keys Labels

Note that when the soft keys labels are shown the user can customize them. #### Data Window

It is possible to customize the data window layout among None (only charts), General (text area on the right side of the screen), 1line small, 1 line large, 2 lines small. The <u>default</u> setting is General. **'MENU' + "GENERAL SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "DATA WINDOW" + 'ENTER'** 

#### Date (Simulation)

Sets the date of the simulated fix. Inserts date using the ShuttlePoint knob. 'MENU' + "ADVANCED SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "SIMULATION" + 'ENTER' + "DATE" + 'ENTER'

#### Date Format

#### Datum

The <u>Latitude</u> and <u>Longitude</u> lines printed on any map are based on certain models of the shape of the earth: these models are called Datum or <u>Coordinate Systems</u>. There are many different Datum in use, each one gives different <u>Lat/Lon</u> positions for an identical point on the surface of the earth (see Part A of "**C-MP/**<sup>2</sup> Handbook").

### Dedicated key

A key with permanently defined function. These keys are labelled on the front panel of the chartplotter. Default






Figure 8c - NMEA DISPLAY Page

**DSC (Digital Selective Calling)** Digital Selective Calling is a semi-automated method of establishing a radio call, it has been designed by the International Maritime Organization (IMO) as an international standard for establishing VHF, MF and HF radio calls. It had also been designated part of the Global Maritime Distress and Safety System (GMDSS). It is planed that DSC will eventually replace aural watches on distress frequencies and will be used to announce routine and urgent maritime safety information broadcasts.

This new service will allow mariners to instantly send a distress call with GPS position (when connected to the transceiver) to the USA Coast Guard and other vessel within range of the transmission. DSC will also allow mariners to initiate or receive distress, urgency, safety and routine calls to or from another vessel equipped with a DSC transceiver.

#### press any soft key + ' Log' (if it is present)

Shows the <u>Distress Call</u> LOG page or <u>Position Request</u> LOG page. It depends which of the two was selected. The default is <u>Distress Call</u>. From the <u>Distress Call</u> page it is possible to select the <u>Position</u> Request page and viceversa.

When a Distress Call or a Position Request is received the chartplotter will automatically mark the position on the chart and add the information on the proper Log. A pop-up screen advise the user that a Distress Call or Position Request call has been received. Within the pop-up screen it asks the user if he would like to view the call on the chart ("VIEW ON CHART") or exit the pop-up screen.

If the user selects the "VIEW ON CHART" another pop-up window appears that allows the user to Go to vessel ("GOTO VESSEL"), exit to the previous page selected or stay on this current view (remained on the selected map screen).

"GOTO VESSEL" activates the navigation to the Distress Call or Position Request icon. The chartplotter will change the chart scale to allow showing the Distress Call (or Position Request) icon and the vessel's icon simultaneously on the screen. The chartplotter will then verify if there are obstructions (land or low water) between the two positions. It there are found the chartplotter will show a pop-up screen saying that the navigation to the Distress Call cannot be set automatically and the user must define a <u>Route</u> to avoid the obstacles. The bar is filled when the satellite is used for solution. As a example, the satellite with PRN=11 is used for solution with SNR=34, Azimuth=170 degrees and Elevation=30 degrees.




Figure 8e - GPS Status page



#### Home (mode)

When the cursor is moved to a position other than the vessel and 'CLEAR' is pressed, the cursor is moved over the ship icon and disappears. The map is centered on the ship's position and it scrolls when the ship moves: all operations refer to the ship's position.

Pressing 'CLEAR' from map display if a valid fix is received sets Home mode (also called Navigation mode), otherwise sounds 3 beeps error and shows a warning message saying "No valid position fix received. Home mode cannot be set". Move the cursor to deactivate Home mode (also activating any of the find functions exits from Home mode).

#### Info Level

Sets information degree Detailed or Basic. Selecting Basic, information obtained by the Info function about an object is related on the particular characteristics of that object by selecting Detailed (Info Level Detailed) the information is enriched by further details. The angle between the magnetic and geographic meridians at any place, expressed in degrees West or East to indicate the direction of magnetic North from true North. It changes from point to point, and (at the same point) with time.

Selects the Map Datum among 130 items (the list of all Map Datum available is shown in the Part A

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of "C-MP D Handbook"). WGS 1984 is the default Map Datum.

When the chart page or any data screen is selected, the soft keys labels are not shown. By pressing one of the five soft keys their labels for the current functions are shown on the screen immediately above the keys. When the <u>soft keys</u> labels are shown, pressing the associated soft key the relative function is executed. Pressing 'CLEAR' the five soft keys labels disappears.

Note that when the soft keys labels are shown the user can Customize Soft keys Labels. Pressing and holding any of the five soft key shows a pop-up window that contains all possible data pages assignable to the soft keys (see Section 3.1.1).



A calculation of the rate of movement of the ship over the ground.

#### Speed (Unit)

Sets the speed unit among Kts = knots, Mph = miles per hour e Kmh = kilometers per hour. The default setting is Kts.

'MENU' + "GENERAL SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "UNITS OF MEASURE" + 'ENTER' + "SPEED" + 'ENTER' Speed Filter

Turns On/Off the Speed Filter. When it is On, you can filter the speed of the ship, to optimize it. The default setting is Off.

#### Spot Soundings

Static Navigation

#### TD = Time Difference

Loran-C positions are determined by precise timing of the intervals between reception of pulses transmitted by pairs of stations in the selected <u>chain</u>. Between any two stations a ship must be located somewhere along a line of possible positions where the measured Time Difference, TD, between arrival of pulses from those stations would be observed. The TD is measured from the time of reception of the master station signal to the time of reception of the slave station signal. 


Figure 8i- Temp Graph page

#### Tide

The periodic rise and fall of the surface of oceans, bays, etc., due principally to the gravitational interactions between the Moon and Earth.

#### Tide Info

The Tide Info feature is the combination of a new tide heights database that will be included within new C-CARDs and new features which calculate the tide graph for all primary and secondary ports worldwide. This function can calculate the <u>tide</u> heights for any past or future date and as a by-product of this calculation will also display the Maximum and Minimum <u>Tide</u> height and time for the day selected plus the times of Sunrise and Sunset. At some chart levels, the chartplotter will display a new Tide Diamond Symbol for every Port or tide point in the database covered by that particular C-CARD

#### Tide Stations

Finds the nearest Tide Stations (up to 10) on the map, from the boat position - if a valid fix is received - or from the cursor position - if the fix position is not good. 'MENU' +"FIND" + 'ENTER' + "TIDE STATIONS" + 'ENTER'

#### Tides and Currents

Turns On/Off the displaying of <u>Tides</u> and <u>Currents</u>. The <u>default</u> setting is On. 'MENU' + "MAP SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "MARINE SETTINGS" + 'ENTER' + "TIDES & CURRENTS" + 'ENTER' Time (Simulation)

Sets the time of the simulated fix. Inserts time using the ShuttlePoint knob.

When the tracking function is On and the type of Track storing is Time, the chartplotter can store a fix

When the Time Line is set to Infinite the line always reaches the screen frame. When the Destination is set on DSC position, if the current setting of Time line is Off, it must be automatically changed to Infinite. The default setting is Infinite.

Turns On/Off the displaying of Underwater Objects. (Diffuser, Obstruction, Wreck, Cable - submarine, Cable area, Pipeline area, Pipeline - submarine/on land. The <u>default</u> setting is On. 'MENU' + "MAP SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "NAV AIDS SETTINGS" + 'ENTER' + "UNDERWATER OBJECTS" +

'ENTER'

► Unit of Measure (menu) Sets the units for <u>Distance</u>, <u>Speed</u>, <u>Depth</u> and <u>Altitude</u>. 'MENU' + "GENERAL SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "UNITS OF MEASURE" + 'ENTER'

### User C-CARD (menu)

The chartplotter uses the optional user C-CARD to save user data: it is a convenient medium to store and retrieve your information. Before a new user C-CARD can be used, you must format it. The formatting function initializes the user C-CARD and prepares it for storing information. Remember that if an user C-CARD is not blank, formatting it will destroy any data already present on the user C-CARD (the user C-CARDs must be formatted in order to be reused, this operation means all old data memorized on the user C-CARD will be lost). A time scale based on the rotation of the earth that is used by most broadcast time services.

#### ► (Magnetic) Variation

It is possible to calculate the Magnetic Variation in an Auto(matic) or Manual mode, by inserting the step for calculation of <u>Magnetic Variation</u>. The <u>default</u> setting is Auto. 'MENU' + "ADVANCED SETUP" + 'ENTER' + "COMPASS + 'ENTER' + "VARIATION" + 'ENTER'

#### Visible (Track)

To enable (On) or disable (Off) the displaying of <u>Track</u>. The <u>default</u> setting is On. 'MENU' + "TRACK" + 'ENTER' + "VISIBLE" + 'ENTER'

■ WAAS = Wide Area Augmentation System The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), in cooperation with other DOT organizations and DOD, is augmenting the GPS/SPS with a satellite-based augmentation system, the Wide Area Augmentation System. It will provide a signal-in-space to WAAS users to support en Route through precision approach navigation. After achieving initial operational capability, the WAAS will then be incrementally improved over the next years to expand the area of coverage, increase the availability of precision approaches, increase signal redundancy, and reduce operational restrictions.

### ► Waypoint

Any point to which one intends to navigate. A sequence of Waypoints makes up a Route plan. Inserting Waypoint: 'ENTER' + "ROUTE" + 'ENTER'



#### Zoom-In

Shows more detail in a smaller area.

#### Zoom-Out

## > Zoom Type

There are two different modes to change chart scale By Zoom and By Scale. When By Zoom is selected, in cartography pressing 'ZOOM IN' shows more details of a smaller area, by changing the chart scale and zooming in on your display. Press 'ZOOM OUT' to operate similarly to the 'ZOOM IN', except in reverse, changing the scale and showing a wider, otherwise less detailed view. Pressing and holding 'ZOOM IN'/ZOOM OUT' allows the quick zoom, that is, the fast change of the chart scale where only the land areas are drawn. When 'ZOOM IN'/ZOOM OUT' is release all map details are shown. Otherwise when By Scale is selected if 'ZOOM IN' or 'ZOOM OUT' is pressed the chartplotter will show the Zoom Window: pressing the 'ZOOM IN'/ZOOM OUT' or moving the *ShuttlePoint* knob up/down moves the scale and bar graph, press 'ENTER' to zoom to the scale. Press 'CLEAR' to quit the Zoom Window and keep the selected chart scale.

The default setting is By Zoom.
